A LITTLE LONG BUT I TRULY MISS MY OLD FRIEND!

Today we mourn the passing of a beloved old friend, Common Sense,

who has been with us for many years. No one knows for sure how old he was, since his birth records were long ago lost in bureaucratic red tape. He will be remembered as having cultivated such valuable lessons as: -Knowing when to come in out of the rain; - Why the early bird gets the worm;- Life isn't always fair; - And maybe it was my fault.

Hello Fellow Dancers,

Have you ever noticed how much fun a dance is when there are several people attending and everyone is having a great time? There are several factors that contribute to a successful dance.

The primary one is the attraction factor. What is the reason that people want to come to the dance? It can be the unique theme chosen for the dance. It can be that the caller is known as an enjoyable one to dance to. It can be due to good promotion of the dance. This can be fostered by establishing a favorable reputation of your group or club.

Establishing a good reputation usually takes a little time and effort. Think about the image that your club projects out. Are you a friendly club? Do you support other clubs' dances? Do you go dance to other callers? Do you try as a group to dance as well as you can? Do you try to mingle and dance with the visitors? When you travel do you mix with the other dancers instead of grouping all together? Do you plan banner raids to other clubs to attempt to get them to return to get their banners? If there are disagreements within your club, do you keep them as invisible to the visitors as possible? Do

you provide some kind of light refreshments on all your dance nights, not just party night? When out of town visitors attend your dance, do you get to know them and introduce them to other members of your club? Think about the reputation that your group wants to have and work on it.

One way that dances can be larger is by doing our best to bring more people into the hobby. That is why we have classes. The next class for the Single Spinners begins on Tuesday February 7, 2012. Probably the best way to get new dancers into the class is by personal invitation. There are some exhibitions planned by the Association. This is the perfect opportunity for the Single Spinners to promote their new class. There should be times that we get people out of the audience up to do beginners dancing. Who knows, maybe some people might think that learning to dance might just be the activity that they have been looking for.

Have you ever thought about walking through a busy mall or grocery store in your square dance clothes? You might be surprised how many people walk up to you and say that they used to square dance and/or they are interested in learning or coming to watch the

dancing. Then you can pull a flyer out of your purse or pocket and invite them to come. The most common question that Freya and I get asked is "Where do you dance?" The answer is that there is dancing several places around town. We tell them about our club, the club nearest where they live and about the dances in Balboa Park. What are you doing to promote the Single Spinners' new class and square dancing in general?

An additional way to attract dancers to your club is by supporting your caller when he calls for other clubs. I am quite sure that he would like it if we as a group came out to support him because this is the perfect opportunity to attract other dancers to come visit the Single Spinners. Will you come?
